Scripture referenced in today's message: John 19:31, John 19:33-34, Mark 15:44, Matthew 27:60-66
The movement was over when a large stone was rolled over His tomb. But wasn't done.
When the Sabbath was over, Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James, and Salome bought spices so that they might go to anoint Jesus' body. Very early on the first day of the week, just after sunrise, they were on their way to the tomb and they asked each other, "Who will roll the stone away from the entrance of the tomb?" But when they looked up, they saw that the stone, which was very large, had been rolled away. As they entered the tomb, they saw a young man dressed in a white robe sitting on the right side, and they were alarmed. "Don't be alarmed," he said. "You are looking for Jesus the Nazarene, Who was crucified. He has risen! He is not here. See the place where they laid Him. But go tell His disciples and Peter, 'He is going ahead of you into Galilee. There you will see Him, just as He told you." (Mark 16:1-7)

Jesus came to set us
"How can some of you say that there is no resurrection of the dead? If there is no resurrection of the dead, then not even Christ has been raised. And if Christ has not been raised, our preaching is useless and so is your faith. And if Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile; you are still in your sins. But Christ has indeed been raised from the deadFor since death came through a man, the resurrection of the dead comes also through a Man. For as in Adam all die, so in Christ all will be made alive." (1 Corinthians 15:12-14, 17, 20-22)
Credibility of Jesus' Resurrection (Benjamin C.F. Shaw) 1. Death by crucifixion was not something that the followers of Jesus were likely to invent 2. The burial account fits with all historical evidence 3. The empty tomb was easily verifiable (there are no contradictory accounts) 4. The apostles claim to have met the resurrected Jesus face-to-face 5. These apostles were willing to suffer and die for these claims 6. Those who were very unlikely to be converted to this belief were converted by means of personal experiences of the resurrected Christ Jesus conquering death, reminds us that He is absolutely sovereign over
Bottom Line: Jesus came to set us free.
