People who consider themselves to be followers of Jesus are not ______ from the straining in order to get the same kind of gains as everyone else.

I said in my heart, "Come now, I will test you with pleasure; enjoy yourself." But behold, this also was vanity. I said of laughter, "It is mad," and of pleasure, "What use is it?" I searched with my heart how to cheer my body with wine... I made great works. I built houses and planted vineyards for myself. I made myself gardens and parks, and planted in them all kinds of fruit trees. I made myself pools from which to water the forest of growing trees. I bought male and female slaves, and had slaves who were born in my house. I had also great possessions of herds and flocks, more than any who had been before me in Jerusalem. I also gathered for myself silver and gold and the treasure of kings and provinces. I got singers, both men and women, and many concubines, the delight of the sons of man. So I became great and surpassed all who were before me in Jerusalem. Also my wisdom remained with me. And whatever my eyes desired I did not keep from them. I kept my heart from no pleasure, for my heart found pleasure in all my toil, and this was my reward for all my toil. Then I considered all that my hands had done and the toil I had expended in doing it, and behold, all was vanity and a striving after wind, and there was nothing to be gained under the sun. (Ecclesiastes 2:1-11)

Vanity: In this Hebrew context, vanity means a breath or a vapor; ultimately meaningless

Scripture: Ecclesiastes 3:14-17

Without God, our life is meaningless and we just die, but if God is central in our life, then life has meaning and everything that happens has greater purpose for us and those around us.

Bottom Line: *Whatever season you find yourself in, if God is included then there is purpose, meaning, and even beauty. But when He is not, then all that results is frustration, hopelessness, and despair.*
