Christians can complain about their life or circumstances and they can even complain about God. When we freely complain, it not only reveals our ungratefulness for what has been provided, but it strikes at the heart of because He is good and only wants what is best for us even if we don't see it yet. So if a person lives many years, let him rejoice in them all; but let him remember that the days of darkness will be many. All that comes is vanity. (Ecclesiastes 11:8) Knowing who God is, knowing what He has done for us, and knowing that our life has meaning because He is in our lives, well that is reason to . . Rejoice, O young man, in your youth, and let your heart cheer you in the days of your youth. Walk in the ways of your heart and the sight of your eyes. But know that for all these things God will bring you into judgment. Remove vexation from your heart, and put away pain from your body, for youth and the dawn of life are vanity. (Ecclesiastes 11:9-10) When we such pain, losses, and feelings year after year, we become empty shells walking around with smiling masks over them. (Hair begins turning white) the grasshopper drags itself along... (Walking becomes difficult) and desire fails, because man is going to his eternal home, and the mourners go about the streets... (Realization of the lack of importance of life priorities in light of eternity)
