"For the love of money is a root of all kinds of evil." (1 Timothy 6:10)

If money is not handled properly, it can easily corrupt us, control us, worry us, and even strangle our soul.

"Watch out! Be on your guard against all kinds of greed; life does not consist in an abundance of possessions." (Luke 12:15)

"No one can serve two masters. Either you will hate the one and love the other, or you will be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve both God and money." (Luke 16:13)

A man was there by the name of Zacchaeus; he was a chief tax collector and was wealthy. Zacchaeus wanted to see who Jesus was, but because he was short he could not see over the crowd. So he ran ahead and climbed a sycamore-fig tree to see Him, since Jesus was coming that way. When Jesus reached the spot, He looked up and said to him, "Zacchaeus, come down immediately. I must stay at your house today." So he came down at once and welcomed Him gladly. (Luke 19:2-6)
